## Biography of Alden Wright

Alden Wright is a recent graduate from the Eastman School of Music, where he studied organ with Nathan Laube. He is a native of Salisbury, North Carolina. As a performer and national young competitor, Alden holds several distinctions, including being named the winner of the 2019 Arthur Poister National Competition in Organ Playing. Previous awards include first place in the 2014 Columbia, SC AGO Young Organist Competition and the 2016 University of North Carolina School of the Arts Organ Competition. He was a recipient of the Robert and Ann Stigall Scholarship, sponsored by the Charlotte Chapter of the American Guild of Organists from 2013-2015, and was awarded the Pogorzelski-Yankee Memorial Scholarship for undergraduate studies. Alden has performed in many student and solo recitals throughout the country and has participated in masterclasses

with many of the world's top performers. As a passionate church musician, Alden enjoys developing his knowledge of liturgical music through programs such as the Royal School of Church Music's Carolina Course, hosted at Duke University, where he served as Organ Scholar in the summer of 2019. Previously, Alden has held a number of prestigious positions including Assistant Organist to Director of Music Peter DuBois at Third Presbyterian Church in Rochester from 2018-2020. Following his studies at Eastman, Alden was appointed to serve as Organ Scholar at Truro Cathedral in Truro, England under Director of Music Christopher Gray, an opportunity which was postponed and deferred due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, but which will be realized in August 2021.

## Wesley Morris Parker (1927 – 2021)

Wesley Morris Parker, age 93, died on February 25, 2021. He was born August 25, 1927 in Little Rock, Ark., the youngest child of John Wesley Parker and Cleda Lancaster Parker. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brothers, Merrill William Parker, Marion Edward Parker, and Melvin Riley Parker, as well as by his sister Mildred Parker Devoe. He is survived by his nephew, James Melvin Parker (Judy) of Conway, Ark.; two great-nieces, Kelly Robbins Koenigsberger (Uwe), Huntington, N,Y., and Holly Robbins Paynter (Todd), Paragould, Ark.; a great-great-nephew, Matthew Paynter and Sarah Paynter.

Parker served in the United States Army, the U.S. Army Reserve and the United States Air Force.

He received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville and a Master of Arts Degree from Chicago State University. In addition, he studied at the University of South Carolina, the University of Maryland (overseas program), Northwestern University, Northeastern Illinois University, the University of Illinois (Chicago Circle Campus), New York University, the University of York (England), Cambridge University (England) and Newbattle Abbey College (Scotland).

Mr. Parker taught high school English for 33 years, first in the Pulaski County Special School District, then in Springfield, Ill., Calumet City, Ill., Skokie, Ill., and finally in the Little Rock Arkansas School District.

He was an Episcopalian and a faithful member of Christ Episcopal Church of Little Rock.

At the request of Mr. Parker, there will be no services. Burial will be in Oakland Cemetery, Little Rock, Ark. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to Christ Episcopal Church of Little Rock.
