

WHEREAS, the AGO was founded in 1896 as an educational and service organization and is organizing one of the largest global music celebrations of its kind this year; and

WHEREAS, the AGO's mission is to encourage excellence in the performance of organ and choral music, as well as promote the organ and provide a forum for education and inspiration for its members; and

WHEREAS, the international Year of the Organ will feature numerous events worldwide including concerts, recitals, organ-building workshop, organ music appreciation classes for students; and

WHEREAS, the 18,000 members of the AGO in the United States and abroad will celebrate the "King of Instruments" its colorful history, and its contributions to the universal language of music throughout the year; and

WHEREAS, the Central Arkansas Chapter, a regional chapter of the American Guild of Organists established in 1929 as the Arkansas Chapter and re-chartered in 1957 as the Central Arkansas Chapter will officially commence observance of the International Year of the Organ with a concert featuring acclaimed young organist Ms. Chelsea Chen; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mark Stodola, Mayor of the City of Little Rock, Arkansas, do hereby proclaim October 24, 2008 as

"International Year of the Organ Day"

and urge all citizens of Little Rock to join me.

Phil Bordeleau Dean: CACAGO Chelsea in Brief: Originally from San Diego, California, Ms. Chen studied piano from a young age with Jane Bastien and Lori Bastien Vickers. At fifteen she began organ lessons with Leslie Robb, and later with Monte Maxwell. She then went on to study with John Weaver and Paul Jacobs at Juilliard, receiving her Bachelor's and Master's degrees. From 2003-06 she was organist at Emmanuel Presbyterian Church in Manhattan and a leader of the Juilliard Christian Fellowship. In 2006-2007 she composed and performed in Taiwan as a U.S. Fulbright Scholar. Currently she is in the Artist Diploma program at Yale studying with Thomas Murray.

The meeting was called to order.




