From the Dean

Greetings Friends!

A hearty and collegial thank you to Colin MacKnight, Celina Kobetitsch, and the singers of the Trinity Cathedral Evensong Choir for a resplendent service September 17 to mark our 2023 Installation of Officers. What a treat it was to hear Herbert Howells's splendid Gloucester Service to start off our Chapter's program year. Thank you also to Betty Cohen and Bob Bidewell for hosting the lovely gathering in Morrison Hall which followed—a chance to visit and catch up with friends and colleagues we've long known as well as to meet and get to know several folks new to our ranks: Welcome back, and Welcome!

At the installation service, when it came time for the Board and Executive Committee to come forward, Mother Lisa Corey met us at the chancel steps. Before she began reading the AGO mission statement as part of the ceremony, she paused and reminded us to pay close attention and to listen closely to its words. Here's the text:

At the heart of the formation and continuing life of the American Guild of Organists is its mission: To enrich lives through organ and choral music. To achieve this, we: encourage excellence in the performance of organ and choral music, inspire, educate, and offer certification for organists and choral conductors, provide networking, fellowship, and mutual support, nurture future generations of organists, promote the organ in its historic and evolving roles, and engage wider audiences with organ and choral music.

The first half of the paragraph has to do with all of us as organists and choral directors, that we should maintain a high standard in all that we do, and to that end, we should endeavor to become more knowledgeable and to collect more experience within our fields always, and also we should work to promote the education of and to educate others in music and organ playing.

The second half of the mission text has to do with our relationship to others in the community as regards what it is we do. Two verbs stand out: *promote* and *engage*. It's clear that the AGO is much more than an entity to provide a context for organists and choir directors to gather and talk shop. Far beyond that, we are called by our mission statement to promote what it is we do—in talking, explaining, and teaching, and inspiring others in and with music and in particular organ music.

Also, we are charged to engage persons of the community at large with organ music, which engagement simultaneously connects persons with

the organ-playing community. Such engagement includes spreading the word about what the AGO does, not only locally, but also both nationally and in cooperation with similar organizations worldwide (the first half of the paragraph above). Further, the more we engage, the more people we can bring to taking part in those efforts too, whether or not they are active organists. A love for music and a love for organ music are sufficient.

So here's my challenge to all of you based on the words of the AGO's installation service: extend an invitation to friends, neighbors, students, choir members, co-workers, your clergy person(s), and anyone else you might know to attend regular monthly chapter dinners and meetings with you. In fact, each time you attend, bring a guest! Our best advertisers are you, our own members. It may not occur to a person to learn more about the AGO, unless first having been invited to a function as a guest. If you teach organ students, or students of any instrument, mention the AGO to them, how we support music learning and music careers for young people—that's exactly how I became a member many decades ago. Treat a friend of music or two to dinner and introduce them to the AGO.

Also, be sure to keep your own memberships active and attend our chapter meeting and events regularly. From month to month, I am notified by national whose memberships are about to lapse. I reach out and encourage to renew, and also to remind what the benefits are of staying in the AGO.

The action verbs of the AGO mission statement describe in plain and positive terms why membership is important and why we can't afford to keep the AGO a secret. Read them: *Enrich, Achieve, Encourage, Inspire, Educate, Offer, Provide, Promote, and Engage.* It's time now more than ever to put these action verbs into action!

I look forward to seeing you on Saturday, October 7 at First Presbyterian Church, 8th and Scott Streets, Little Rock. And I look doubly forward to meeting your guests this Saturday and welcoming them among us.

Biography of Laura Ellis

Laura Ellis is Associate Director and Professor in the School of Music at the University of Florida. She teaches graduate courses in Sacred Music and applied lessons in organ, harpsichord, and carillon. Ellis holds the DMA in organ performance from the University of Kansas. A carillonneur member of The Guild of Carillonneurs in North America (GCNA), Ellis recently served two years as President of the organization and is director of the Music and Publications Committee. Ellis is also active in the American Guild of Organists (AGO) where she was elected to three terms as Regional Councillor for the Southeast.

Ellis has performed organ and carillon recitals throughout the US, Canada, The Netherlands, and Australia. Her double-CD organ recording *Music for the Testaments Old and New* was released under the Raven label; her recording *Legacy: Laura Ellis Plays Organ Works of Jeanne Demessieux* is available on Spotify, Pandora, and Apple Music. Her recording of carillon works of Alice Gomez is in production.
